Fukuoka City is Japan's Gate to Asia

Kyushu Island in southwest Japan is the third largest of the four main islands of Japan. Fukuoka City is the most populous city on the Island and its an economic, cultural and transportation center, while also being rich in nature, surrounded by the sea and mountains. It is close to major cities in Southwest Asia (about 200 km to Busan, South Korea, and about 850 km to Shanghai, China), and has many airline and sailing routes from Fukuoka Airport and Hakata Bay. Fukuoka City is one of Japan's important gateways to Asia, and is a busy commercial center that is attracting more and more tourists.





Traditional Culture and People

Fukuoka City has long been a prosperous center of cultural exchange, thanks to its proximity to Asian nations. The City continues to develop as a vibrant new city, even as it maintains its culture and tradition that give evidence of its two-thousand-year history. People in Fukuoka City tend to be of an upbeat and unpretentious nature, very caring, and they give a warm welcome to visitors from other areas of Japan as well as foreign countries. Fukuoka City also is a safe city, where students can live with peace of mind.

Food Culture

Fukuoka City has an abundance of fresh and tasty food, cultivated by its history and climate. It has four clear seasons of spring, summer, fall and winter, each offering a different set of delicious vegetables, fruits and seafood.

school, and they and the exchange students have active and frequent interactions.








About our Japanese Language Course
